Why: Provide a safe and environmentally responsible manner to dispose of old, unwanted chemicals from your home, farm, basement, garage, workshop, and barn.

Bring products that say: caution, toxic, corrosive, poison, combustible, flammable, warning, danger, or reactive.

DO NOT BRING

- Ammunition
- Appliances
- Computers/Electronics
- Explosives (dynamite, fireworks)
- Fire Extinguishers
- Freon Gases
- High Pressure Cylinders (propane)
- Infectious/Biological Waste/Sharps
- Latex Paint
- Radioactives (smoke detectors)
- Vehicle Batteries

What Should I Do with Unwanted Latex Paint?

- Latex Paint is not a hazardous material. It can be disposed of as a solid with your regular trash - leave the lids off. If the paint is liquid, open the top of the can and allow the paint to air dry. Speed up drying by adding an absorbent such as sand, kitty litter, sawdust or a latex paint hardener (found at hardware/home improvement stores) to the paint.

Be Careful!

These products have warning labels on them for a reason. Before putting them in your vehicle, take the following precautions:

- Keep products in their original containers when possible.
 - Visually inspect containers for proper sealing to prevent leaks and spills. If a container is leaking, put it into a secondary leak-proof container.
 - Do not mix products together. Dangerous reactions can occur when some chemicals are mixed.
 - Pack containers in sturdy boxes lined with plastic in the trunk of your vehicle, away from the driver, passengers and pets. Cardboard boxes work well, but containers (other than gasoline cans) and boxes cannot be returned to you.
 - Please do not put items in plastic bags.
 - If a product does not have the original label, label it yourself if you are certain of the contents. This will help to dispose of it properly.
 - Always store products in a secure place, away from children, pets, sparks and flames.
